I NEED TO RID MY DRESS OF RUST MARK

Q. One enchanted evening I must have leaned against a rusty railing. My beautiful, not to mention expensive, white cocktail dress has a rusty line across the derrière.

Neither dry cleaning nor hand washing has removed it.

Is there any way I can save my dress?

A. Try Magica Rust Remover. It's safe to use on most fabrics. "We tried it on just about everything with pretty good results," says Magica's aptly named Rusty Williams in Oshkosh, Wis.

He recommends the watersoluble gel rather than the spray for fabrics. It shouldn't remove suything other than the rust stain, but to be safe, test it on an inconspicuous part of your dress first.

Two 1.25-ounce tubes cost

\$7.90 plus shipping and handling. It's also available in an 8-ounce spray or gel bottle. Order two for \$19.95 plus shipping and handling.

Magica removes rust stains from ceramics, concrete, fiber-glass, etc. It may dull highly polished surfaces such as brass and chrome and some ceramic glazes. Don't use it on glass. It will etch it.

SHOES DON'T FIT MISMATCHED FEET

Q. My feet have very different sizes. My left foot is size 12 and my right foot is 14EEEE. New Balance is the only athletic shoe manufacturer who makes them that large and that wide.

Is there anywhere I can get one pair that fits without having to buy a pair of both sizes?

A. Write to the National Odd Shoe Exchange, P.O. Box 1120, Chandler, AZ 85244-1120, or call 480-892-3484. Include details of the shoe sizes you need. Don't forget to include your name and address.

In recent years, the Nationa Odd Shoe Exchange has helped people overseas. "We've pu shoes on the feet of people in Swaziland and in an orphanage in Romania," Kelly said.

It also accepts donations on new, unworm shoes from the public. Since it's a registered nonprofit organization, donations are tax-deductible.
